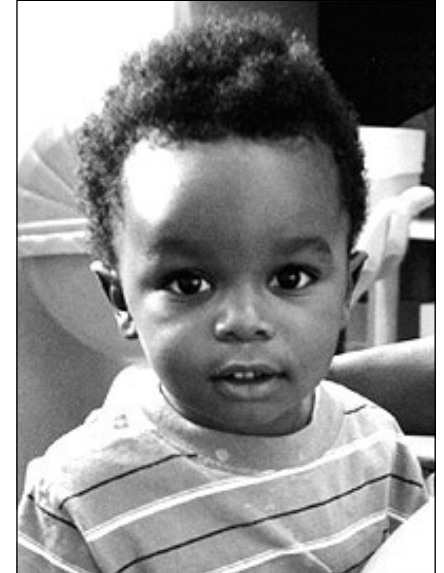

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The **Child Care Inclusion Challenge Project (CCICP)** helps families find, access, and maintain quality, inclusive child care for children with disabilities and special health care needs.

Families can choose between family child care settings, centers, and before- and after-school programs.

Child care providers can gain training, technical assistance, and on-site consultation.

### ***We Serve . . .***

**Families** who have children with special needs. (Children can range from birth on up.) As a family, you'll receive:

- Assistance in finding, accessing, and maintaining child care that is appropriate to your needs
- Support in communicating and maintaining good relationships with your child care provider
- Information about community resources that may be helpful to you, your children, and your provider
- Peer support

**Child care providers** who are actively seeking to accommodate children with special needs. If you are a provider, you can benefit from:

- On-site consultation about working with children who have special needs, managing challenging behavior, enhancing your child care environment, and many other topics

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- Support in communicating and maintaining good relationships with families
  - Information about community resources that may be helpful to you and the families you serve
  - Opportunities to participate in citywide training about The Americans with Disabilities Act, inclusion of children with special needs, and other related subjects

## **OUR GOALS**

To support and encourage San Francisco families who have children with special needs by helping them find, access, and maintain high-quality, inclusive child care

To assist San Francisco child care providers by supporting their efforts to provide quality, inclusive care to children with special needs

To encourage and support efforts by the City of San Francisco to make high-quality, inclusive child care available to children with special needs
